Tips For You!

Keeping your little one in bed

3-year old children need about 11 hours at night with a 1.5 hours nap. Once they give up the nap, they still need about 11 to 12 hours at night until they're about 8 years old, when they require about .5 hours less. A child learns lots of different ways to creep back into your bed at night.

- 1. A child may say he/she needs a drink, a snack, or is scared or lonesome.
- 2. Or he'll say, "I can't sleep."
- 3. Your child is always testing your limits.

It is easy to give in and let your child into your bed. But, you are not doing yourself or your child any favors. Children need to learn to sleep on their own.

Happy Labor Day!

Why Do We Celebrate Labor Day?

Labor Day, an annual celebration of workers and their achievements, originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters. In the late 1800s, at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and seven-day weeks in order to eke out a basic living. Despite restrictions in some states, children as young as 5 or 6 toiled in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning a fraction of their adult counterparts' wages. People of all ages, particularly the very poor and recent immigrants, often faced extremely unsafe working conditions, with insufficient access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and breaks.

As manufacturing increasingly supplanted agriculture as the wellspring of American employment, labor unions, which had first appeared in the late 18th century, grew more prominent and vocal. They began organizing strikes and rallies to protest poor conditions and compel employers to renegotiate hours and pay. More at: https://www.history.com/topics/holidays/labor-day-1
